BERLIN SCIENCE WEEK DARE TO KNOW

Berlin Science Week is an annual festival from 1 to 10 November that brings together thousands of people from the worlds of science, business, politics, the arts, and society at large - across Berlin and online.

We connect more than 500 speakers, over 150 organisations and an audience exceeding 20,000 during the ten festival days. As an international festival, we combine in person formats throughout Berlin with hybrid and online events, thus reaching local, national and international audiences.

Our focus is on exchange and reflection: the programme is based on interactive and often interdisciplinary formats ranging from panel discussions, workshops, exhibitions, to VR-experiences, film screenings, music installations and much more.

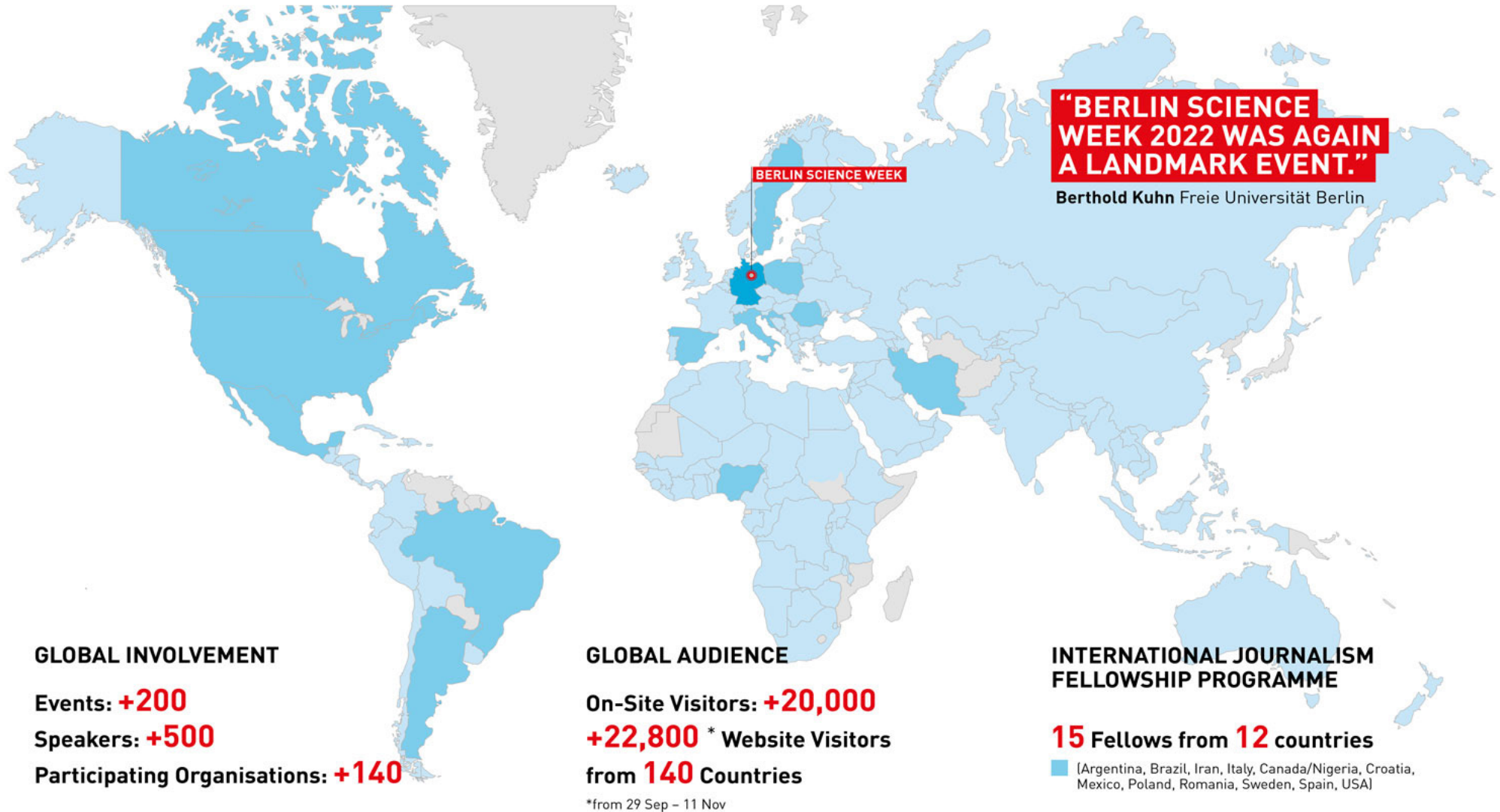
Guided by the motto '**Dare to Know**', we partner with organisations from all over the world to showcase scientific excellence, promote debates on the world's major challenges, and find new, interactive, and fun ways to make science, research, and innovation more engaging.

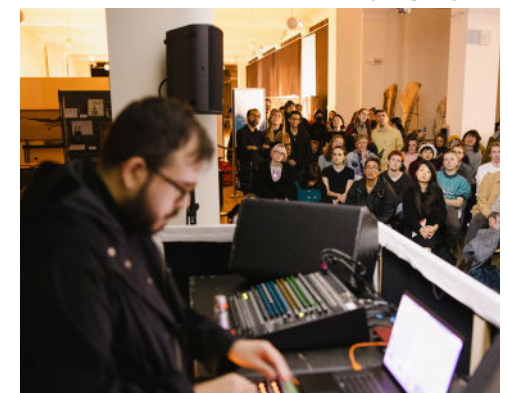

HOW TO GET INVOLVED

THERE ARE SEVERAL OPTIONS FOR GETTING INVOLVED

Please contact us to discuss which format best meets the needs of your organisation.

Option one



You organise an event at a time and location of your choice (online and hybrid options welcome)

Create your physical event anywhere in Berlin and the world: at your headquarters, a rented space or in cooperation with a partner. Opt for an **in person**, **hybrid** or **digital event**.

Option two



You become part of the CAMPUS, our festival centre on 3–4 NOVEMBER

Choose one of our exhibition or event spaces at the striking Museum für Naturkunde Berlin and organise an event under the motto „**Our narratives, our future**“ among fossils, scientists, and thousands of visitors. Hybrid options are available.

Option three



You implement an event at our ART & SCIENCE FORUM

Join our curated Art & Science Forum at Holzmarkt 25 if you are organising an exhibition, a performance, a film screening, or are planning another creative format. The forum is organised under the motto „**Creative science, precise art**“.

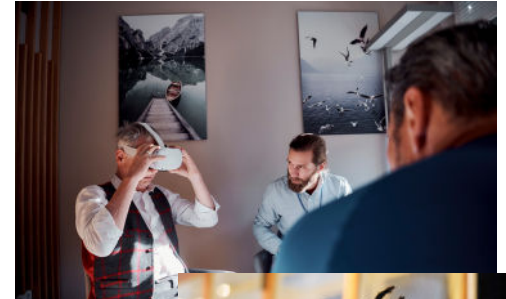
HOW TO GET INVOLVED

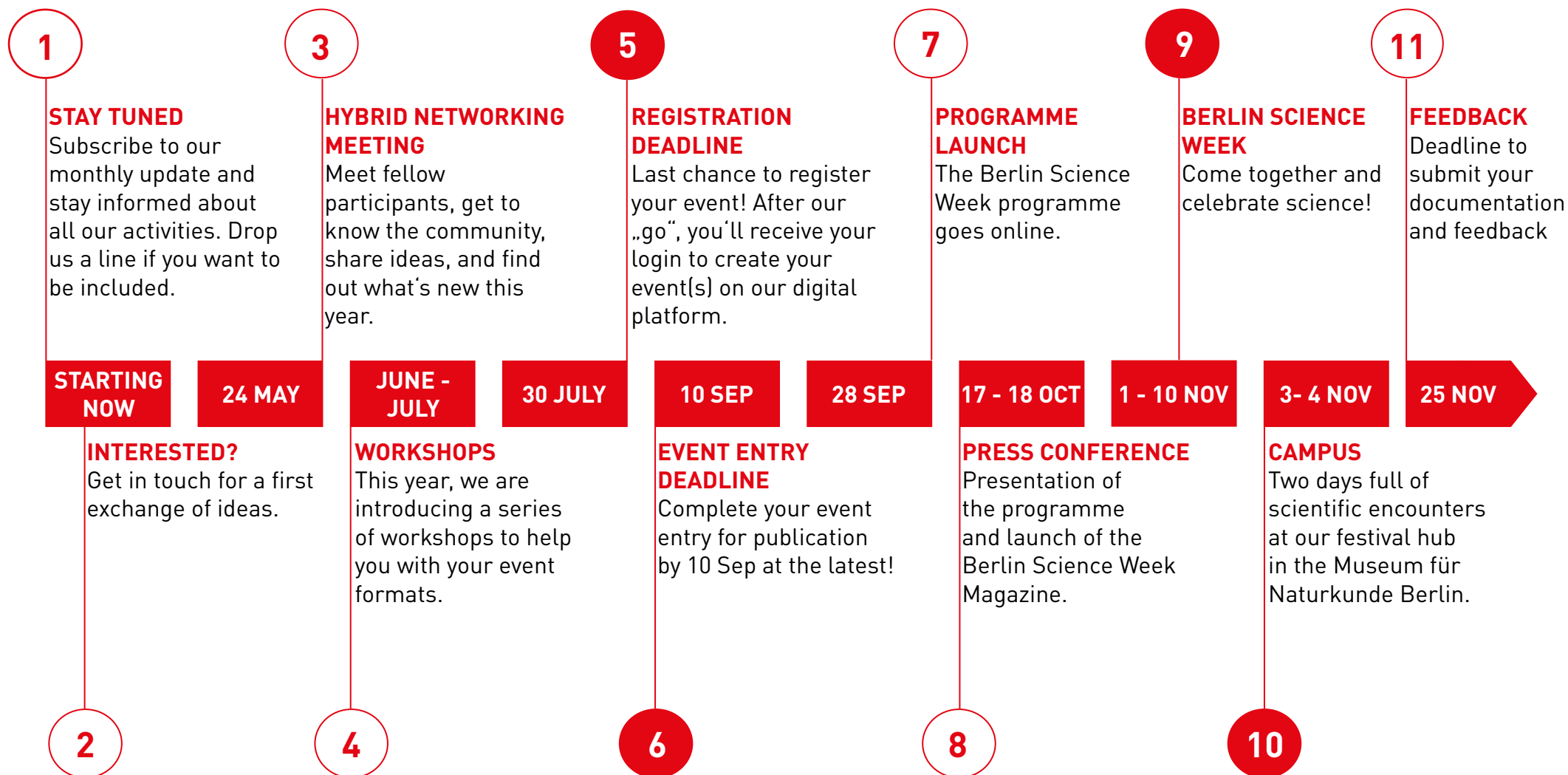
Our focus is on live, in person events. Online and hybrid alternatives are of course also possible. Each event will have its own listing in the programme and dedicated event page. Livestreams from Youtube or Vimeo can be embedded, other digital tools can be linked through a prominent button, and there is the possibility of integrating interactive online tools - get in touch and let's discuss!

We do not charge a fee for participation in the Berlin Science Week. However, you are financially and administratively responsible for your own events.

We encourage bold, out of the box, experimental ideas and aim for a balanced mix of formats (e.g. workshops, panel discussions, exhibitions, games, field trips, lectures, performances, slams, multi-day forums, art installations, and many more).

We explicitly welcome contributions from **all backgrounds** and offer the same stage to people of all genders, ethnicities, religions, sexual orientations, and abilities.



This year, we have decided to cap the number of events at Berlin Science Week.

Please note that we reserve the right to curate our programme and select specific events. This will enable us to present a programme that showcases the best in terms of scientific progress, engagement, interdisciplinarity, and creativity.

We have made this decision in order to ensure that your events receive the attention and promotion they deserve. With this step, we aim to make the programme more coherent and clear for our audiences, to maximise our communication strategy, and reach the highest number of interested participants.

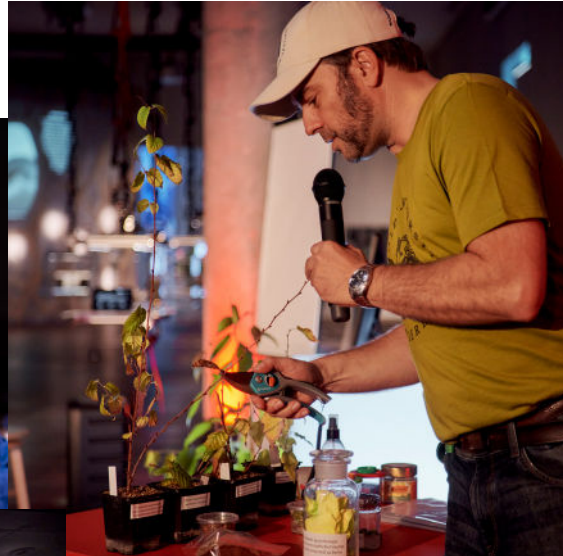

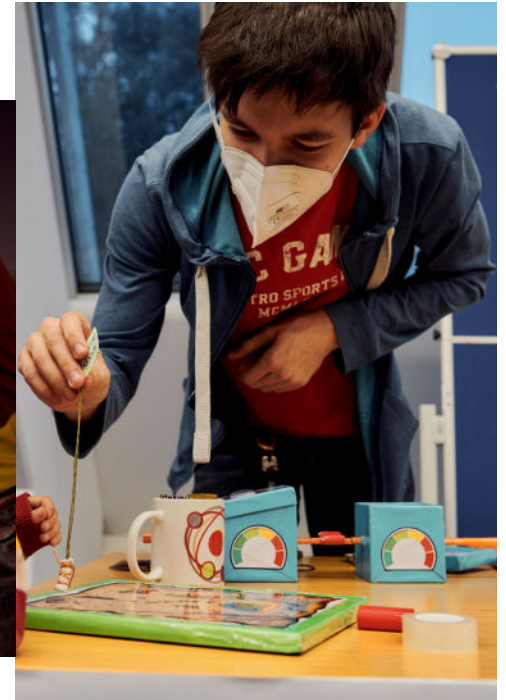

BERLIN SCIENCE WEEK WHO ATTENDS

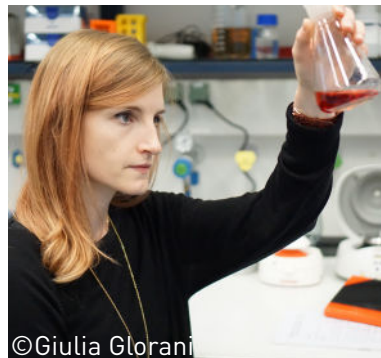
The people attending Berlin Science Week represent a wide range of backgrounds and expertise.

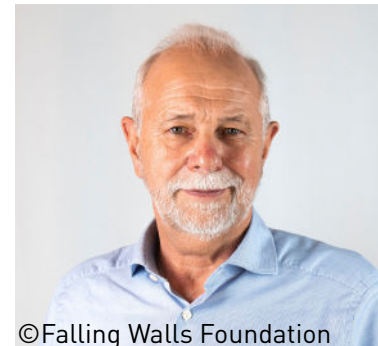
